Four Chaplains Day





USAT DORCHESTER

This year, February 3, 1943 marks the 82nd anniversary of the sinking of the United States Army Transport Dorchester (SC-290583) a converted luxury liner that was crossing the North Atlantic, transporting more than 900 troops to an American base in Greenland, and the legendary acts of selflessness of four Army chaplains who were aboard.

Four Chaplains Day, as U.S. Congress has declared, honors the four chaplains who went down with their ship and gave their life jackets to other passengers.

Moving among them were four Army chaplains: George Fox (Methodist), Alexander Goode (Jewish), Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed) and John Washington (Roman Catholic).

The chaplains talked with and listened to the men -soothing apprehensions, offering encouragement or sharing a joke. By their concern, their camaraderie with the men and one another, and their very presence, they brought solace. The self-sacrifice of the four chaplains was a heroic act. It was not the only heroic act aboard the Dorchester. But it was the identity of these four young men, representing three great faiths of the American people that adds symbolism to their sacrifice.

Fox, Goode, Poling and Washington were posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross and the Purple Heart, and in 1948, Congress declared Feb. 3 to be Four Chaplains Day. The four chaplains were also honored with a U.S. postage stamp that year.



Because of the Medal of Honor's strict requirements of heroism under fire, Congress authorized a one-time Chaplain's Medal for Heroism on July 14, 1960. The award was presented to the chaplains' next of kin Jan. 18, 1961.

OBTAING DD-214 FORMS

We have had several inquires about how to get a copy of service records, namely the DD-214 form (discharge papers) that is required when joining the American Legion.

Below is one way to obtain a DD-214.

The DD-214 can now be requested online, but ONLY BY:

A military veteran, or next of kin of a deceased, former member of the military. The next of kin can be any of the following: surviving spouse that has not remarried, father, mother, son, daughter, sister, or brother. Persons fitting one of these two categories can request military records online from the <u>eVetRecs Website</u>. Be sure to read all instructions before beginning the request process.

If you are not the veteran or next of kin, you must complete the <u>Standard Form 180 (SF 180)</u>. You must then mail it or <u>fax it</u> to the appropriate address on the form.

The Defense Department issues to each veteran a DD-214, identifying the veteran's condition of discharge - honorable, general, other than honorable, dishonorable or bad conduct.

For complete instructions on how to apply for a copy of your DD-214, see <u>Veterans' Service Records</u> from the National Archives and Records Administration.

To apply for a copy of your DD-214, you will need to submit a form SF-180 Request Pertaining to Military Records, which you can download from:

http://www.archives.gov/research_room/ obtain_copies/standard_form_180.pdf

Be sure to download and complete BOTH SIDES of the SF-180. The back of the form contains important mailing addresses and instructions.

You will need the free Adobe Acrobat .pdf file viewer to print the SF-180. <u>Download Adobe Acrobat</u>. The Standard Form 180 is formatted for legal size paper (8.5" x 14"). Please print that way if your printer can accommodate that. If your printer can only print on letter size paper (8.5" x 11"), select "shrink to fit" when the Adobe Acrobat Reader "Print" dialog box appears.

The drawing for the "Queen" is held every Wednesday at 7:00 PM. You can purchase tickets any day at the Bar or at the SAL table Wednesdays in the Lounge.

All Post 1376 members and bona fide guests over the age of 18 may play The Queen of Hearts.

One ticket will be drawn each week; except the first and twenty-sixth week, when three will be drawn, until the Queen of Hearts is found. Tickets will be a series of two part-sequentially numbered raffle tickets. TICKETS WILL COST \$1.00 EACH, and you may purchase as many tickets as you wish.

Each player shall write their name and phone number and card number you would like selected if you are not present at the drawing on the Posts part of the ticket, which shall be deposited into the raffle box. The purchasing player shall retain the other portion of the ticket as a receipt for verification purposes. New Eligibility Requirements For The American Legion

The LEGION Act, signed into law July 30, 2019, expands eligibility in The American Legion to include veterans who served in U.S. military conflicts previously unrecognized by Congress as war eras.

If you have served at least one day of federal active duty in the United States Armed Forces since December 7, 1941, and have been honorably discharged or are still serving - you are eligible for membership in The American Legion!

*Because eligibility dates remain open, all active duty members of the U.S. Armed Forces are eligible to join the American Legion at this time, until the date of the end of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States.

****U.S. Merchant Marine eligible only from December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946 (WWII).**

A copy of your DD-214 or Honorable Discharge Certificate confirming your eligibility is required when joining.

Above is the new membership application form for the American Legion. If you know of someone who may be interested in joining, cut this form out for them.

Dues are currently \$50.00, checks can be made out to New Hartford American Legion Post 1376 and they can mail it along with a copy of their DD214 discharge papers to:
