POST COLOR GUARD **ELECTION PROCEDURE**

Any person shall be eligible for membership in the **Color Guard who is:**

A. A member of Post 1376 Legionnaire, S.A.L or Aux-Any nominations for officers should be put into the liary, in good standing. In good standing means you are a paid up-to-date member on your dues and are not on suspension.

B. Prospective candidates will be considered by the Color Guard membership.

C. If the candidate is accepted, full membership will commence immediately.

D. All members are volunteers and serve as such.

E. Prior to a vote of acceptance by the Color Guard, a prospective member must attend a regular meeting, for an informal discussion before the acceptance vote is taken.

F. A majority vote of the Color Guard membership shall be necessary for acceptance, at its regular meeting, into the Color Guard by a raise of hands and motion accepted by the members.

Commander, First Vice Commander, Road Captain, Secretary, Treasurer/Quarter Master, and Sergeant - of Arms will be elected at the April Color Guard Meeting each year exclusively from the members of the Color Guard.

Nominations will be at the March meeting. All elections shall be done by raise of hands and motion accepted by membership.

The positions of the Chaplain and Historian shall be appointed each year by the elected Color Guard Commander.

The elected Officers serve One (1) year, but may be reelected unlimited terms, if elected by the membership.

Term of Office will be One (1) year – May 1st – April 30th.

St. Patrick's Day, a feast day (March 17th) of St. Patrick, patron saint of Ireland. Born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, he was kidnapped at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped but returned about 432 CE to convert the Irish to Christianity. By the time of his death on March 17, 461, he had established monasteries, churches, and schools. Many legends grew up around him—for example, that he drove the snakes out of Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity. Ireland came to celebrate his day with religious services and feasts.

Boston held its first St. Patrick's Day parade in 1737, followed by New York City in 1762.

Since 1962 Chicago has colored its river green to mark the holiday. (Although blue was the color traditionally associated with St. Patrick, green is now commonly connected with the day.)

Irish and non-Irish alike commonly participate in the "wearing of the green"—sporting an item of green clothing or a shamrock, the Irish national plant, in the lapel.

Corned beef and cabbage are associated with the holiday, and even beer is sometimes dyed green to celebrate the day. Although some of these practices eventually were adopted by the Irish themselves, they did so largely for the benefit of tourists.

To all of our Irish friends and those who will be Irish for the day we wish you a Happy St. Patrick's Day.

"Dogface Soldier"

In 1942, Lieutenant Ken Hart and Corporal Bert Gold, both natives of Long Beach, New York, who were then serving in the United States Army, cowrote the song, "Dogface Soldier". Both men were later assigned to other branches of the service, one in South America, the other to the Pacific Theater and the song nearly faded into obscurity. Meanwhile the song had been carried to North Africa by a G.I. with a guitar who played it for his buddies while they were in camp. The song struck home and soon caught on ... spreading from mouth to mouth and unit to unit without help from the radio, sheet music, or records. It became the most popular song sung by American servicemen during the Second World War.

New Hartford American Legion House Rules for the Queen of Hearts



The hunt for the "Queen" continues, as of February 20th the "Queen" now stands @ \$2263 with 41 cards left.

The drawing for the "Queen" is held every Wednesday at 7:00 PM. You can purchase tickets any day at the Bar or at the SAL table Wednesdays in the Lounge.

All Post 1376 members and bona fide guests over the age of 18 may play The Queen of Hearts.

One ticket will be drawn each week; except the first and twenty-sixth week, when three will be drawn, until the Queen of Hearts is found. Tickets will be a series of two part-sequentially numbered raffle tickets. TICKETS WILL COST \$1.00 EACH, and you may purchase as many tickets as you wish.

Each player shall write their name and phone number and card number you would like selected if you are not present at the drawing on the Posts part of the ticket, which shall be deposited into the raffle box. The purchasing player shall retain the other portion of the ticket as a receipt for verification purposes. The player holding the winning ticket stub shall be declared the winner of the drawing and shall be entitled to "Search for the Queen of Hearts".

Each winner shall select one of the facedown playing cards, which shall be turned over by the member in charge. If the card turned over is the Queen of Hearts, the holder of the winning ticket selecting that card shall be awarded 60% of the grand prize pool. New Eligibility Requirements For The American Legion

The LEGION Act, signed into law July 30, 2019, expands eligibility in The American Legion to include veterans who served in U.S. military conflicts previously unrecognized by Congress as war eras.

If you have served at least one day of federal active duty in the United States Armed Forces since December 7, 1941, and have been honorably discharged or are still serving - you are eligible for membership in The American Legion!

*Because eligibility dates remain open, all active duty members of the U.S. Armed Forces are eligible to join the American Legion at this time, until the date of the end of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States.

****U.S. Merchant Marine eligible only from December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946 (WWII).**

A copy of your DD-214 or Honorable Discharge Certificate confirming your eligibility is required when joining.
